All bathrooms in Nikolaiev Baby House have been renovated thanks to your donations. The last one was terminated around summer 2011. Next in the pipeline are renovation of small group kitchens and floors in the group living rooms.



❖ Olga Ivanovna, director of Nikolaiev Baby House (NBH), presented us two very difficult children cases this year. First, Ivan, for whom no treatment seems to be possible in Ukraine (at least none of the specialists who auscultated him could propose any!) . Therefore we have suggested adoption through 'Reece's Rainbow' (reecesrainbow.org), a specialized American organization. And it seems that the process with a Canadian family is well on its way.





And then **Pasha**, an amazing little boy suffering from congenital arthrogryposis (severe deformation of members and joints). This terrible syndrome prevents him from being able to move around independently and thus, constantly needs an adult presence nearby. Pasha already made two trips to pediatric orthopedic clinic in Kharkov for evaluation and planning of long treatment he

will have to suffer in hope of being able to use his legs like everybody one day.

Unfortunately, while nothing was made during first six years of his life, the first step is a major orthopedic surgery on both legs (knee hip and ankle joints).



During last fall

trip, Vika and Pascal spent a week in Kharkov to accompany Pasha and his nurse to the hospital. It was a busy week

with many medical tests, endless discussions at the pediatric orthopedic clinic and logistical organization

of their stay. All the while Pasha was laughing and desperately trying to communicate in Russian with Pascal. First leg was operated with success and second leg is scheduled shortly before Christmas. Pasha's stay in hospital will extend over the holiday season and thus will be longer than 2 months.



❖ A fourth family has joined the sponsorship program for Zeleniy Gay boarding school, which supports



teenagers willing to pursue a professional education, after they leave state sponsored boarding school. This family has pledged to support **Vita** training as a seamstress.



Olga Igorivna has successfully graduated as technician for dairy products. Despite extensive searching, she could not find a job in her



profession and now has accepted a position with Ukrainian railway company. She lives in her own small apartment in Nikolaiev which she can only afford thanks to the continued support from her 'Godmother' Kathrin. **Christophe**, who joined **Vika** 

and Pascal during their second week of last fall trip, visited new Olga's home. It is gratifying that the Olga Igorivna "project" slowly comes to an



end and in spite of numerous hurdles in the beginning can now be considered as a great success.
